Alternatively, however, by later today the entire newsletter along with a larger format version of the tables should be downloadable or viewable as a PDF with working links on the Waterford Committee Website (<u>votewaterford.org</u> or <u>waterfordnydemocrats.com</u>).

Each year John T McDonald III, our Assemblyman for the 108th District, sends out a survey to his constituents asking them for basic demographic information, with a questionnaire asking them to share their priorities with him. John takes these surveys seriously, and frequently cites them in casual chats to explain his position on issues facing the NY legislature.

You may well have received one of the surveys through the U.S. Mail. Or if you did not, or if you wish to free John's office from the work of inputting the form, you can **CLICK HERE** to find the online version. In any event, we urge you to share your view and preferences with John, who does an amazing job representing his district, which includes all of Waterford, in the State Assembly. We are truly lucky to have him.

It only takes a few minutes, and this may well be the easiest and most meaningful action you can take to have your voice heard at any level of government.

Governor Hochul signed several new laws into effect recently, at least two of which merit special mention.

- 1) As of today, January 1 2025, **all employers must provide at least 20 hours of paid time off for pregnant employees** to attend related medical appointments such as sonograms. New York is apparently the first state to mandate this benefit. **Hooray for New York!**
- 2) Also effective today, **Health Insurance Companies are no longer allowed to charge co-pays for insulin**. According to the NY Times, about 1.8 million New Yorkers have diabetes. And while about half of all states regulate the cost of insulin, New York is the first to eliminate co-pays. So again, **Hooray for New York!**

Saratoga County and Waterford Voting Summaries

A copy of the certified 2024 voting results is available at the Saratoga County Board of Elections. Click Here to view or download the various documents reporting election results for the General Election (and past elections). The entire download includes a map of Waterford voting districts, early voting records, a certified PDF of the County election results, and a spreadsheet of the totals for the entire County.

Waterford Summary Report for Presidential Election 4,046 ballots were cast

- Kamala and Tim lost in Waterford by almost 10 points, with 1,712 Democratic votes and 111 votes from Working Families voters, for a total of 1823 votes
- Trump & Vance got 1,996 Republican votes and 227 Conservative Party votes, for a total of 2,223 votes

The BOE spreadsheet indicates there were 19 write-in votes, 43 blanks, and 16 voids.

Saratoga Count went Blue, edging out bad judgment and outright Insanity by about one-half point.

A total of 132,817 ballots were cast, with a breakdown as follows: Kamala and Tim received 66,321 votes, defeating Trump by 2,381 votes (almost 2 points), of which:

- 62,823 (95%) votes were cast in the Democratic column.3
- 3,498 votes (5%) were cast in the Working Families column.

Trump & Vance received 63,940, of which:

- 57,120 (89%) votes were cast in the Republican column
- 6,820 (11% were cast in the Conservative Party colum

There were 551 write-in votes for seven presidential candidates, as follows:

• Jill Stein: 333 votes

Chase Oliver: 123 votes
Oliver Cruz: 40 votes
Peter Sonski: 27 votes
Cornel West: 17 votes
Chris Garrity: 6 votes

• Raymond Anthong Scollin: 5 votes

Also notable is that:

467 Saratoga County voters left the Presidential column blank

An additional 538 ballots were voided for unlisted reasons.

And now for Waterford Election Results, which will run to several pages.

It might be helpful for many old timers as well as newcomers to Waterford to understand that there are 8 voting districts in our Township. Maps of the districts can be viewed on the Saratoga County Board of Elections (BOE) by <u>CLICKING HERE</u>. The maps are somewhat confusing, however, so the districts can be loosely described below (in a way that may or may be less confusing that the maps):Districts 1 and 2 comprise the Village, with District 1 being east of third and south of Broad, while District 2 is the neighborhood that includes St. Mary's Church and west of third all the way to Halfmoon.

- District 3 is west of 6th Street, north to the Schoonhoven apartments and railroad tracks, and the neighborhoods either side of Washington Ave up to Flight Lock Road/Fonda Roads.
- District 4 is that part of the Northside closest to the Mohawk River, and covers both sides of Saratoga Ave. It is bounded by Vanderwerken and Grace Street north of Vanderwerken.
- District 5 includes the Rural Cemetery as well as Sugarloaf Pond and the neighborhoods close to it.
- District 6 is a long strip comprising the streets north of St Joseph's Cemetery on the west side of Middletown Road. This district extends west to the junction of Fonda and Flightlock Roads.
- District 7 is the streets bounded by the Champlain Walking Trail on the east, up to Halfmoon Township on the north; Middletown Road on the west; and the railroad track on its short south side.
- District 8 is the area south and west of Fonda Road and Flightlock Road. It extends west to the Mohawk River, and north to the border of Halfmoon. It comes together at its northwest corner with Districts 6 and 7 at the intersection of Fonda Road and Middletown Road.

Voting results are shown below for five races in which there was a Democratic Candidate

Note that the column showing "Dem total, all ballots," includes Working Family Party votes as well as Democratic
votes. The hope is that these results might provoke constructive thought and conversation relevant to a discussion
about how to understand and motivate Waterfordians to be kind and better informed in their voting decisions.
